





MINUTES

On May 10, 2022, at 10h00, met the *ad hoc* jury composed by Professor Athina Sachoulidou, who presides, Professor Giulia Priora and Professor Fabrizio Esposito, to assess the applications to the Postdoctoral Research Grant No. 1/2022, to be awarded in the context of the activity of the project "Tracking illicit money flows_101022004_TRACE", funded by the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme H2020-SU-SEC-2020, hosted by the Centre for Research and Development on Law and Society (CEDIS - UID714) of the Nova University Law School.

The jury began by verifying that the following applications had been submitted in response to the call for applications:

After the analysis of the elements presented in the applications according to the evaluation parameters foreseen in the call, the following candidates were admitted:

The jury decided –on the basis of the following weighting criteria set out in the call for applications: scientific and curricular background (40&), motivation letter (30%) and relevance and adequacy of the previous path to the research project (30%)– that none of the submitted applications is adequate inasmuch as the candidates do not have experience in the research areas the Horizon2020 TRACE project pertains to. The jury closes the selective process without offering the position to any of the candidates.
